2. Consideration and action on purchasing a Workman 3300 (full size utility vehicle) and two (2) ZTR deck mowers to be used by the Parks and Recreation Department for \$33,996.00. These items will be purchased through Professional Turf Products using the Buyboard Cooperative Purchasing Program pricing. **Linda Tyler, Director of Community Services**

Linda Tyler gave an overview of the comments from the Town Hall Meeting of the requests from residents for additional parks and recreation facilities and programs.
