

RESOLUTION NO.2015- 52

A RESOLUTION CALLING A RUNOFF ELECTION FOR PLACE FIVE OF THE CITY OF COPPERAS COVE CITY COUNCIL TO FILL A VACANCY, DESIGNATING THE DATE OF SAID RUNOFF ELECTION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sec. 2.021 of the Election Code of the State of Texas, and the City of Copperas Cove Charter, it is provided that if no candidate for a particular office receives the vote necessary to be elected in an election requiring a majority vote, a runoff election for that office is required; and

WHEREAS, a canvassing of the returns and declaring the results of a General Election held on November 3, 2015 was approved by the City Council on November 12, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the canvass determined that, in the race for Council Member Place One no candidate received a majority of the votes cast; and

WHEREAS, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Council Member Place One were Azeita Taylor and David Morris.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COPPERAS COVE, TEXAS:

SECTION

1

There is hereby ordered a runoff election to be held in the City of Copperas Cove, Texas, on the 8th day of December 2015, for the purpose of electing a Council Member to Place One. The candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast for City Council Member, Place One shall be declared elected to such office.

SECTION

2

Only resident's qualified voters of said City shall be eligible to vote. Said election will be held at the Coryell County Annex Rm., 201 S. 2nd St.

Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted at the City of Copperas Coryell County Annex. 201 S. 2nd St., Copperas Cove, Texas, 76522 on November 23, 24, 25, 30, and December 1, 2, and 3, 2015.

Election Day voting will be conducted on December 8, 2015 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

**SECTION
3**

That the City Secretary is hereby directed to cause notice of said election to: (i) be published at least once, Notice of a runoff election shall be given in accordance with Chapter 4 except that a notice under Section 4.003(a)(2) or (b) must be posted not later than the 15th day before election day. A copy of the published notice that contains the name of the newspaper and the date of publication shall be retained as a record of such notice, and the person posting the notice shall make a record at the time of posting stating the date and place of posting in accordance with Texas Election Code Section 4.005.

**SECTION
4**

That applications for ballot by mail for Coryell residents shall be mailed to: Justin Carothers Coryell County Tax Office, P.O. Box 6, Gatesville, Texas 76528. Applications for early voting ballot by mail must be received no later than the close of business on November 27, 2015.

**SECTION
5**

All ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the Election Code. Paper ballots shall be used for early voting by mail and eSlate Direct Recording Electronic (DRE) Voting System shall be used for early voting by personal appearance and voting on Election Day, both of which are part of the eSlate DRE Voting System.

**SECTION
6**

Said Runoff Election will be held in accordance with the Election Code and the State of Texas. Notice of said elections shall be given in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Election Code and the City Secretary is hereby instructed to have said notice posted and published in accordance with state law.

**SECTION
7**

That should any word, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this resolution be adjudged or held to be void or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said resolution, which shall remain in full force and effect.

PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED on this 17th of November 2015, at a regular council meeting of the City of Copperas Cove, Texas which was held in compliance with the Open Meetings Act, Tex. Gov't. Code, §551.001, et.seq. and at which meeting a quorum was present and voting.

BY THE TERMS OF THIS CONTRACT made and entered into by and between the CITY OF COPPERAS COVE, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY," and the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COPPERAS COVE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL DISTRICT," and Justin Carothers, Tax Assessor Collector of Coryell County, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTING OFFICER," pursuant to the authority in Subchapter D, Section 31.092, of Chapter 31, of the Texas Election Code, agree to the following particulars in regard to coordination, supervision and running of the City and School District's November 3, 2015 Joint General and Special Elections.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set out. **IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:**

I. DUTIES AND SERVICES OF CONTRACTING OFFICER. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for performing the following duties and shall furnish the following services and equipment:

A. The Contracting Officer shall arrange for appointment, notification (including writ of election), training and compensation of all presiding judges, alternate judges, the judge of the Central Counting Station and judge of the Early Voting Balloting Board.

a. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for notification of each Election Day and Early Voting presiding judge and alternate judge of his or her appointment. The Contracting Officer will determine the number of clerks to work in the Central Counting Station and the number of clerks to work on the balloting board.

b. Election judges will be trained by the contracting officer.

c. The Contracting Officer shall compensate each election judge and worker. Each judge shall receive \$8.00 per hour for services rendered.

Each alternate judge and clerk shall receive \$8.00 per hour for services rendered.

B. The Contracting Officer shall procure, prepare, and distribute voting machines, election kits and election supplies.

a. The Contracting Officer shall secure election kits which include the legal documentation required to hold an election and all supplies including locks, pens, magic markers, etc.

b. The Contracting Officer shall secure all tables, chairs, and legal documentation required to run the central counting station.

c. The Contracting Officer shall provide all lists of registered voters required for use on Election Day and for the early voting period required by law. The Election Day list of registered voters shall be arranged in alphabetical order by polling place, in lieu of alphabetic by each precinct in each polling place.

d. The Contracting Officer shall procure and arrange for the distribution of all election equipment and supplies required to hold an election.

1. Equipment includes voting machines, ADA compliance headphones, transfer cases, voting signs and tote boxes.

2. Supplies include smart cards, sample ballots, early voting mail ballots, pens, tape, markers, etc.

C. The Contracting Officer, Justin Carothers, shall be appointed the Early Voting Clerk by the City and the School District.

a. The Contracting Officer shall supervise and conduct Early Voting by mail and in person and shall secure personnel to serve as Early Voting Deputies.

b. Early Voting by personal appearance for the City and School District's November 3, 2015, Joint General and Special Elections shall be

conducted during the time period and at the locations listed in Exhibit A. All voting by personal appearance on Election Day shall be held in the designated County precincts as shown in Exhibit B.

c. All applications for an Early Voting mail ballot shall be received and processed by the Coryell County Tax Office, P.O. Box 6, Gatesville, TX 76528.

1. Application for mail ballots erroneously mailed to the City or School District shall immediately be faxed to the Contracting Officer for timely processing. The original application shall then be forwarded to the Contracting Officer for proper retention.

2. All Federal Post Card Applicants (FPCA) will be sent a mail ballot. No postage is required.

d. The Contracting Officer shall arrange for the use of all Election Day polling places.

E. The Contracting Officer shall be responsible for establishing and operating the Central Counting Station to receive and tabulate the voted ballots in accordance with Section 127.001 of the election Code and of this agreement. Counting Station Manager and Central Count Judge shall be Justin Carothers. The Tabulation Supervisor shall be Bill Wheelless.

a. The tabulation supervisor shall prepare, test and run the county's tabulation system in accordance with statutory requirements and county policies, under the auspices of the Contracting Officer.

b. The Public Logic and Accuracy Test of the electronic voting system shall be conducted.

c. Election night reports will be available to the City and School District at the Central Counting Station on election night. Provisional ballots will be tabulated after election night in accordance with law.

d. The Contracting Office shall prepare the unofficial canvass report after all precincts have been counted, and will provide a copy of the unofficial canvass to the City and School District as soon as possible after all returns have been tallied.

e. The Contracting Officer shall be appointed the custodian of the voted ballots and shall retain all election material for a period of 22 months.

1. Pending no litigation and as prescribed by law, the voted ballots shall be shredded 22 months after the election.

2. The City and School District can obtain the list of registered voters from the Elections Administration Office after this retention period. Pending no litigation and if the City or School District does not request the lists, the Contracting Officer shall destroy them.

f. The Contracting Officer shall conduct a manual count as prescribed by Section 127.201 of the Texas Election Code and submit a written report to the City and School District in a timely manner. The Secretary of State may waive this requirement. If applicable, a written report shall be submitted to the Secretary of State as required by Section 127.201(E) of the aforementioned code.

II. DUTIES AND SERVICES OF THE CITY AND SCHOOL DISTRICT. The City and School District shall assume the following responsibilities:

A. The City and School District shall prepare the election orders, resolutions, notices, justice department submissions, official canvass and other pertinent documents for adoption by the appropriate office or body. The City and School District assumes the responsibility of posting all notices and likewise promoting the schedules for Early Voting and Election Day.

B. The City and School District shall procure and provide the Contracting Officer with the ballot layout and Spanish interpretation in an electronic format.

a. The City and School District shall deliver to the Contracting Officer as soon as possible, but no later than **August 26th, 2015**, the official wording the City and School District's November 3, 2015, Joint General and Special Elections.

b. The City and School District shall approve the ballot format and audio cards prior to the final printing.

C. The City and School District shall post the publication of election notice by the proper methods with the proper media.

D. The City and School District shall prepare and submit to the U.S. Department of Justice under the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, any required submissions on voting changes.

E. The City shall compensate the Contracting Officer for any additional verified cost incurred in the process of running this election or for a manual count this election may require.

F. The City shall pay the Contracting Officer 90% of the estimated cost to run the said election prior to October 2, 2015. The Contracting Officer shall place the funds in a "contract fund" as prescribed by Section 31.100 of the Texas Election Code. The Deposit should be delivered within the mandatory time frame to:

G. The City and School District shall pay the cost of conducting said election, less partial payment, including the 10% administrative fee, pursuant to the Texas Election Code, Section 31.100, within 30 days from the date of final billing.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

A. Nothing contained in this contract shall authorize or permit a change in the officer with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the City and School District's November 3, 2015, General and Special Elections is to be filed or the place at which any function is to be carried out, or any nontransferable functions specified under Section 31.096 of the Texas Election Code.

B. Upon request, the Contracting Officer will provide copies of all invoices and other charges received in the process of running said elections for the City and School District.

C. The Contracting Officer shall file copies of this contract with the County Judge and the County Auditor of Coryell County, Texas.

IV. Runoff

- a. If a runoff is required the Contracting officer will hold the election
- b. All procedures affecting the runoff will be the same concerning poll workers, supplies, notices, etc.
- c. The City or School District will determine the dates of the runoff and early voting
- d. The City or School District will determine the location(s) for the runoff
- e. The cost estimate for the runoff will be separate from the General election and should be paid in full after the final invoice is sent following the runoff.




