

## Summary of Do's and Don'ts for Container Use

### DO:

- Write down the serial number of your container and ensure you keep track of your container.
- Place the container at the curb by 7:00 am the day of collection at least four (4) feet away from obstacles and with the handle and wheels towards the residence. If container is not at curb by 7:00 am on the day of collection residents can request a return service for a fee of \$11.28.
- Place all trash in the container, in order to avoid additional fees. All excess trash must be bagged and placed near the 96-gallon container and will be reloaded by the driver at a fee of \$5.07 per container reload.
- *Overloaded container:* A container in which the capacity is exceeded, which is indicated by trash extending above the container rim, so the lid will not close properly. Overloaded containers will be charged \$5.07.
- Bag all trash and keep lid closed to prevent litter. Resident is responsible for any litter left on ground due to trash not being bagged.
- Return your container to storage area after collection. Store your container in the backyard, garage, or any convenient location away from the curb. If container is removed from curb after collection day by city personal a fee of \$11.28 will be charged.

### DON'T:

- Put construction debris, rocks, dirt, concrete, flammables, or hazardous materials in the containers.
- Put hot ashes in the container.
- Overfill the container.
- Pack trash too tightly.
- Paint or write on the container.

- Remove the container from your residence.
- Put yard waste in the container.
- If container is damaged by the resident a fee of \$28.19 will be charged to replace the container.
