Fort Hood and neighboring communities renew Cen-Tex Sustainable Communities Partnership

NOLANVILLE, Texas -- Fort Hood and neighboring communities Killeen, Harker Heights, Copperas Cove, Nolanville, Belton, Salado, Gatesville, and Lampasas make up the Cen-Tex Sustainable Communities Partnership.

The Garrison Commander and Mayors from each of the communities will gather together from 1-2 p.m. April 8 at 100 Gold Star Ave, Nolanville to sign a Memorandum of Agreement to renew the Cen-Tex Partnership for an additional 3 years.

The ceremony will also include a tree planting with the GC and Mayors; a signing to proclaim April as Sustainable Environment Month; and recognizing an individual from each partner community with the 2021 Cen-Tex Sustainable Communities Partnership Environmental Ambassador Award.

Awardees include community members, staff, youth, and the 504th Expeditionary Military Intelligence Brigade for their efforts in fostering community service and promoting beautification, conservation, pollution prevention, and recycling through youth and community initiatives.

Mayor Andy Williams, City of Nolanville, will present to each community an apple tree to be planted and to represent the collaborative partnership in promoting sustainability within the region.
